The MPH selection committee checks the students' competencies against those acquired at the end of the first year of the MPH. It validates all or part of the ECTS previously acquired and, when necessary, requires students to take additional course. The second year of the MPH also enrolls a few students through the Erasmus Mundus mobility program called Europubhealth;

Programme aims	The MPH offers basic and advanced schemes of study, involving knowledge, skills and techniques that can be applied to various public health issues in diverse contexts (such as health services agencies or health & environmental organisations, in the public or private sector, in developed or developing countries).The MPH is both a professional qualification and a contributor to generic skills in research. It provides traditional MPH core courses and beyond that, options with an innovative approach to developing public health agendas in various contexts including crisis situations
